The AFRICA2020 SEASON UNVEILS ITS HEADQUARTERS (1/4)

The Africa2020 Season, initially planned for last June and postponed on account of the health context, will start on 1st December 2020. Supported by the Institut français, the Season will bring together over 200 events organised all over mainland France and its overseas territories until July 2021. As the launch date draws closer, the Institut français unveils in four sequences the major elements of this outstanding Season. Today, we shed light on the fifteen Headquarters (HQ) which will span the entire national territory.

15 HEADQUARTERS STRUCTURING AN OUTSTANDING SEASON

How to showcase a continent spanning over 30 million km² and home to over 1.2 billion citizens? Such will be the great challenge of the Africa2020 Season, dedicated to Africa and designed as "an invitation to look at and understand the world from an African perspective", in the words of General Commissioner N'Goné Fall.



With over 200 events organised all over mainland France and in the overseas territories, the Africa2020 Season will unfold from December 2020 until July 2021. We are introducing today the Headquarters (HQ), true pan-African cultural centres.

Each HQ will be implemented by an African team which, in collaboration with the French hosting institution, will develop a programme over several weeks. The HQs will therefore be designed in the spirit of a small, temporary pan-African cultural centre hosting several multidisciplinary projects (exhibitions, shows, concerts, film screenings, round tables, master classes, creative workshops, and culinary experiences).

Each HQ will serve as a friendly place for meetings, discussions, experiments and socialising, as well as for information on the projects offered across the region and in the rest of the French territory.

The aim of the Headquarters is to create increased opportunities for encounters between African players (operators, artists, intellectuals) and the French public in

order to foster spaces for discussions on the challenges of the 21st century anchoring the programme, that echo with the <u>five major themes of the Africa2020 Season</u>.

THE AFRICA2020 SEASON

Initiated by the President of the French Republic, the Africa2020 Season is an outstanding project designed around the major challenges of the 21st century: social progress, technology, climate/environment, citizenship, economic challenges. This Season is an invitation to look at and understand the world from an African perspective.

The Season is dedicated to the 54 States of the African continent. Africa2020 will take place from December 2020 to July 2021 in the entire French territory. It will include more than 200 events organized in all of the national territory - in Continental France as well as the French overseas territories.

The Africa 2020 Season is operated by the Institut français with the support of the Ministry of Europe and Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Culture, National Education, Youth and Sports, the Ministry of Higher Education, Research and Innovation and in partnership with the Agence française de développement, and with the participation of regional and local authorities that are partners of the Institut français. The Season also enjoys outstanding support from the Patrons Committee of Africa 2020, and from its media partners.

The Institut français is the public institution in charge of France's international cultural actions. Under the dual auspices of the Ministry of Europe and Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Culture, the Institut contributes actively to France's cultural diplomacy.
